# PARASHAT VAYECHI - SHABBAT BPY BY JESSICA KOHN EARLY CHILDHOOD DIRECTOR

Each year I wait in anxious anticipation for Parashat Veyechi because this is a very special Shabbat for BPY. Did you know that the source for the name of our school is in this week's parashah?! This week Yaakov Avinu knows that he is about to die so he gathers his twelve sons, the roots of our nation, to give each one of them a special blessing consistent with his nature. Zevulun will have commercial success, Issachar, diligence and scholarship, Yehuda, leadership and so on. Yaakov blesses each of his sons with success by recognizing what he's good at. We can learn from this that one should not try to be someone s/he is not, but rather focus on being the best YOU that YOU can be. This is a lesson that is taught every day at BPY where we are raising individuals with high self esteem, confidence, and independence.

After Yaakov blesses each son individually, he also repeats the private blessings for all of his sons to hear. In doing so, he shows that while we each have our own areas in which we excel, it is important that we engage in all mitzvot, not only those within our natural comfort zones. The businessperson needs to set aside time for Torah study, just as the Torah scholar needs to be charitable. Yaakov wants his children to enjoy all forms of spirituality and greatness. His blessings, which enable his sons to

transcend their limitations, endow us and our children with that wonderful ability as well. All Jews, regardless of background and level of observance, are equal heirs to Yaakov's blessings. No mitzvah is beyond our potential.

When Yaakov gets to Yosef, his favorite son, he declares,
"Ben porat yosef, ben porat alei ayin..."
"Yosef is a charming and beautiful son, a fruitful vine by the spring...." (Beraishit 49:22)

Because Yosef was protected from the envy of all creatures and was a person unharmed by others, his name became synonymous with abundance, protection, fertility, beauty and splendor. The blessing that Yaakov gave Yosef, which embodies the ultimate wishes that a parent would want to bestow upon a child, is what inspired the founders of our school to choose the name Ben Porat Yosef.

I also find it extremely interesting to learn that the Baal HaTurim points out that the gematria (numerical value) of the words Ben Porat is 732, equal to the numerical value of Ephraim and Menasheh, also 732.

We can learn from this that the berachah of Ben Porat Yosef is the fulfillment of every parents dream for their children, the realization of the blessing "Yesimcha Elokim k'ephraim v'k'Menasheh." – "May Hashem make you like Ephraim and Menasheh." I cannot think of a more fitting message to send to our children learning and growing here at Ben Porat Yosef. Each and every one of their precious neshamot is the fulfillment of Yaakov's berachah to his beloved son Yosef and an essential link in the chain of Am Yisrael.

So, on Friday night, when you bless your child, reflect on what is wonderful and unique about him or her as an individual and when you hear the baal koreh read the words "Ben Porat Yosef" from the Torah on Shabbat morning, give a little cheer for BPY!

Shabbat shalom and chazak chazak v'nit'chazek!


# EARY CHILDHOOD TODDLER




# EARY CHILDHOOD KC

# MIDDLE SCHOOL JUDAIC STUDIES

The 6th grade is focusing during Moledet class about Eretz Yisrael, history, sources from the Torah, navigating on the map and mostly feel the connection to Am Yisrael and Eretz Yisrael. In 6th grade one of the skills that we are focusing in lvrit classes is speaking Hebrew, oral expression. Our Morah Adi the Shlichah from Yisrael created connection with a school in Israel, and they started a twinning school program where students in Jerusalem and in BPY talk about similarities and differences between the places they live. The first step was for BPY students to make a video for students in the school in Jerusalem. Our students spoke in Hebrew, focusing on conversational skills, and introduced the town they live in and focused on comparing similarities and differences. The twin schools sent us a video back and the students could hear, speak and feel the lvrit and the taste of Yerushalayim.

Rav Roee is teaching 7th grade Chumash Devarim Parashat Ekev. The focus in Chumash in 7th grade is analyzing Mefarshim in depth and not reading only the Peshat. Rav Roee taught the students the Berachot and the Shevach- praise of Eretz Yisrael, and introduced the Perush of Sforno about the Shevach of Eretz Yisrael. The students had to analyze the 5 parts of the Shevach and identify the category of each Shevach and how its appeared in the Pesukim. The analysis of the Mefaresh and the connection to the Peshat is an amazing skill that the students are experiencing this year in Chumash class.
