PARASHAT BESHALACH MORAH SARAH BARTGES MIDDLE SCHOOL ASSOCIATE PRINCIPAL


In dedication to my middle school students.....


In parashat BeShalach, we read about the Jews' exodus out of Egypt and the miracle of the splitting of the <code>\PID-D!</code>. One of the pivotal moments in this week's Torah reading occurs when the Israelites are standing on the banks of the <code>\PID-D!</code> with the Egyptian army rushing in behind them and a vast sea lying before them. At that moment, the Jews cry out in panic to Moshe, questioning HaShem's ability to lead them to safety. HaShem's response to Moshe upon Moshe's sharing of this hysteria is as follows - "Why do you cry out to Me? Speak to the children of Israel, that they should go forward" (14:15).

The prompting to move forward is a germane encouragement for those of who are lucky enough to work or live with middle school aged students. During this stage of development, the early adolescent is becoming slowly, or sometimes all too suddenly, aware of his/her individuality and the power that she/he has on influencing the world. At times, the realization of this power can be overpowering and even paralyzing. It is exhausting to suddenly have to be thinking 24/7 about what decisions to make and how those decisions will influence others. As such, it is not uncommon for early adolescents to be lured into just "following the herd", as this requires much less effort and induces less anxiety. In addition, it provides one with the handy "get out of jail free card" - if trouble arises, just blame your words/actions on the fact that you were just following what everyone else was doing.

When the Israelites were standing at the edge of the sea, it took one individual - Nachshon the son of Aminadav - to take the first step in the waters, while everyone else was paralyzed with terror. Nachshon's choice to move forward, demonstrated his trust in HaShem's words that moving forward into the waters was necessary. Although Nachson undoubtedly had fear and trepidation, he knew that a future of freedom could only come to fruition if the Jews were brave enough to take a step towards it, regardless of what the journey resulting from that step would look like. It is my fervent hope that all of the middle school students will experience a moment similar to Nachshon's, a moment where they are standing at a tipping point and make the choice to take a step - one that is guided by faith, bravery, and trust - towards positive change. And so, I urge the students, as they navigate this turbulence and trying time of their lives, to keep their heads up and their eyes open for their Yam Suf moment. And when such an opportunity arises, b"H they will have the courage to take a step forward and not backward, inspiring the rest of us to follow in their footsteps.

Be a Nachshon

The פסוק says:

"ויאמר ה' אל־משה מה־תצעק אלי דבר אל־בני־ישראל ויסעו"

"HaShem said to Moshe, why are you crying out to me? Speak to Bnei Yisrael and travel."

What is HaShem's critique of Moshe? Moshe and the entire Bnei Yisrael are stuck between a rock and a hard place. Behind them is an angry mob of Egyptians consisting of the finest soldiers, horses and chariots chasing after them in order to prevent them from leaving Egypt. Before them is a sea without any means of transportation for crossing, also preventing complete escape from Egypt. There, amidst the chaos, is Moshe and Bnei Yisrael in a bit of a predicament. They are supposed to leave Egypt behind, but how? What else can they do at this point besides cry out towards HaShem for help! Does the situation not justify such a response?

Many commentators explain that HaShem was not critiquing that Moshe was davening to Him at such a dire time. Rather, HaShem's critique was regarding the moment in time in which he was davening. HaShem was telling Moshe not to despair so early, there is still room to try before giving up. Take those extra couple of steps into the Yam Suf to the point where you have exerted all of your physical and mental ability. Once you have done all that you can, then you may pray for help. This is how we can understand the פסוק.

"Why are you crying out towards me", at this moment? You still have room to try to exert more effort. "Speak to Bnei Yisrael and travel", take those extra few steps and then ask for my help.

When faced with the Reed Sea in front of them and the Egyptians closing in, Bnai Yisrael were paralyzed with fear. God made a promise but it took a literal leap of faith for Nachshon Ben Aminadav to jump into the water, demonstrating his belief and as soon as he did so the waters parted. We too have many challenges. BPY is dedicated to meeting those challenges. Be a Nachshon. Please consider donating to our Annual Dinner.

THE BEIT RACHEL SYNAGOGUE ASTANA, KAZAKHSTAN

This synagogue is located in Astana, which is the capital city of Kazakhstan. Beit Rachel is the largest synagogue in Central Asia. It has become a symbol of tolerance in the region. In 2004, President Nursultan Mazarbayev, officially opened the synagogue. Funds were raised by the Jewish community, but the land was donated by the government. Much of the community is Ashkenazi. Many of the original settlers in Kazakhstan were Russian Army conscripts who came in the 17th century. At the time, there were no synagogues and services were held in private homes. Later, Jews fleeing the Holocaust settled in Kazakhstan (around 8,500). Many of the Jews in Kazakhstan have made Aliyah. Presently, there are around 3,300 Jews in Kazakhstan. In addition to the large synagogue, the building houses a community center, day school, food distribution center, elderly care and a summer camp. The reason for building such a large synagogue is to be a public symbol of how Jews and Muslims can get along well together.
